Information for Students, Trainees, Fellows, and Jr. Faculty

The SRM will accept abstract submissions and the top scoring abstracts will be given the opportunity to give an oral presentation or poster presentation as well as be eligible for research awards. Accepted abstracts will be published online at <https://www.ssciweb.org> and <https://www.southern-spr.org>. Apply for awards as part of the abstract submission process. We strongly encourage Fellows/Jr. Faculty to submit abstracts to the 2027 meeting. This meeting offers an atmosphere that allows networking among physician-scientists.

Abstract Policies

No revisions or changes will be accepted to submitted abstracts after the deadline.

1. All abstracts are peer-reviewed and ranked on the basis of scientific merit by experts in the category selected. The Program Committee uses these rankings to develop the final meeting program. Abstracts submitted for presentation will be published at the discretion of the Southern Regional Program Committee. **The decisions of the Program Committee are final.** Abstracts will not be reviewed if received after the deadline.
2. The committee will decide on oral and poster presentations. Submitter will not be given a choice upon submission.
3. SRM requires a **non-refundable** abstract fee of **\$85.00** to cover the costs of processing, review and/or publication. This is **separate** from the registration fee. You **must** register and pay the registration fee to attend and present your abstract at the meeting. Separate payment for each abstract submitted is required. Payment must be made by credit card (American Express, Discover, MasterCard, or Visa). **No checks or purchase orders will be accepted.**
4. **INFORMED CONSENT, DISCLOSURE and COPYRIGHT:** SRM and Tulane University have adopted guidelines for conflicts of interest. Investigators must disclose potential conflicts of interest in connection with abstracts presented at the regional meetings. It is the policy of the Center for Continuing Education at Tulane University Health Sciences Center to plan and implement all of its educational activities in accordance with the ACCME's accreditation requirements and policies to ensure balance, independence, objectivity and scientific rigor. In accordance with the ACCME's Standards for Integrity and Independence in Accredited Continuing Education, everyone who is in a position to control the content of an educational activity certified for *AMA PRA Category 1 Credit™* is required to disclose financial relationships or the absence of relationships with any ineligible companies within the past 24 months that creates a real or apparent conflict of interest. All potential conflicts of interest must be resolved prior to the activity. Individuals who do not disclose are disqualified from participating in the CME activity. Disclosure of off-label, experimental or investigational use of drugs or devices must also be made known to the audience.

Each abstract **must** comply with the following:

(1) personal responsibility for assuring that, at the time of the meeting for which it is being considered, the material herein will not have been published; (2) the material may have been presented at another regional or national meeting with a focused audience like a subspecialty meeting, such that the material will be new to the broader audience; (3) that if accepted, an eligible author is prepared to present it; (4) that any animal studies conform with the "Guiding Principles in the Care and Use of Animals" of the American Physiological Society; (5) that any human experimentation was conducted according to a protocol approved by an Institutional Review Board on ethics of human investigation (if no such Board exists, please state in a separate letter what standards were used to assess the ethical property of the protocol); (6) for case reports, that all required written consents, permissions, and releases have been obtained in compliance with institutional policies and CARE guidelines; and (7) that potential conflicts of interest will be disclosed at the time of the presentation of abstract. All potential conflicts of interest must be submitted in the disclosure form. Such information will

not be available to the abstract review committee and will not prejudice review of the abstract.

Abstract Procedures

Step-by-Step Instructions for Electronic Submission.

To submit your abstract proceed to: <https://srm2027.abstractcentral.com/>

1. Log in with previous credentials or click **Create an Account**. During account creation, please bear in mind:
 - o All fields with a red asterisk are required.
 - o Your e-mail address is the primary method of correspondence. All system e-mails and other notifications related to the meeting will be sent to this address. Please keep your e-mail address up-to-date!
 - o The User ID and password that you create will be needed to log into the site after your account is created. Your User ID must be at least 6 characters long and can be a combination of letters and numbers. User ID and Password are case-sensitive.
2. Once you have logged in, click on the **Submission** tab at the top of page, then on **Create a New Submission** on the left.
3. It is recommended that you step through the submission pages in a methodical manner, going step by step and completing the information as you go along, beginning with **Step 1: Submission Type**.
4. You must select a submission type, **Research Abstract Submission** or **Case Report Submission**, to begin. The submission type cannot be changed once selected and confirmed.
5. The title must be brief and indicate clearly the nature of the investigation. The title should be sentence case (capitalize only the first word and proper nouns). Keep letters uppercase/lowercase if the letters have a specific meaning, such as pH or NaCl. Do not put a period at the end of the title. Abbreviations must not be used in the title.
6. Type or copy/paste each section of the abstract body into their respective fields. For Research Abstract submissions, the body of the abstract must be separated into the fields: **Purpose, Methods, Results, and Conclusions**. For Case Report submissions, the body of the abstract must be in the field: **Case Report**. The entire body of the abstract must not exceed 3000 characters, including spaces. One table and 1 image can be included and do not count toward the character count. Any references should be noted as citations within the text and not as footnotes at the end of the abstract. **Do not include authors or institutions in the body of your abstract.**
7. Apply for awards on **Step 3: Category/Awards**. To view eligibility requirements for each award, click **Details & Conditions** under each award.
8. All co-authors must be added in **Step 4: Authors/Disclosures**. Click **Add Author** at the bottom of the page to create a list of co-authors. Names, email addresses and institutional affiliations of all authors must be provided. A maximum of three (3) institutional affiliations will be allowed per author. Use the drop-down boxes in the **Author Order** column of the list to put authors in the correct order. Make sure that the Presenting Author is listed correctly in Author Order 1 and you have selected "PRESENTER" for this author.
9. The submitting author must answer disclosure questions on behalf of each individual author on **Step 4: Authors/Disclosures**. To answer disclosures for each author, select **Click to review and acknowledge Disclosure** under their name and answer the questions on their behalf.
10. If there are errors or omissions in the submission, you will be prompted to enter the missing information on **Step 6: Review & Submit**. When all required information is entered, click **View Proof** at the bottom of the page. **Carefully check the proof of your abstract.** Be particularly careful to make sure of the following. If you find errors, return to the appropriate page by clicking on the step name in the sidebar menu.
 - Authors names are spelled correctly, are in the proper order and are associated with the correct institution(s)
 - Presenting Author has been correctly identified (name underlined)
 - Special Characters are displayed in the proper places and that there are no typos in the text of the title and body of the abstract.
11. If you exit the system without submitting the abstract, it will be logged in the system as a draft and will appear in the Draft section of the Submissions page when you reenter the system.
12. Click **Submit** to submit your abstract. **Payment is required to complete submission of the abstract.**

Joint Plenary Session**Saturday, February 20, 2027 9:00 AM -11:00 AM****"Regenerative Medicine Across the Lifespan"**

Regenerative capacity across organs decreases with age, and developmental programs are recapitulated with neonates and adults in response to injury or for maintenance of tissue homeostasis. This session will explore regenerative strategies including stem cell therapies to reduce brain injury in newborns and the burden of chronic diseases in adulthood.

SSCI Presidential Symposium**Friday, February 19, 2027; 8:00 AM – 10:45 AM****"Matrix Biology at the Intersection of Aging and Chronic Lung Disease"**

This plenary session will explore the role of the extracellular matrix in regulating lung repair and regeneration, and how aberrant matrix signals contribute to disease.

Manuscript Preparation and Peer-Reviewed Publication

This workshop will address in a highly interactive manner the multiple aspects of publication in scientific journals. Presenter will discuss preparation of materials, including the initial decision that the data are sufficient to justify publication. Issues related to manuscript writing will include length, focus, adherence to journal formats, and referencing. The editorial process from submission to publication will be described in-depth with particular attention to ways in which authors can interact with journal editors. Another section will cover ethical issues in publication including review boards, authorship, duplicate publication, intellectual property rights, and conflict of interest. There will be open discussion of sample manuscripts and outcomes derived from real experiences as well as time to address participant's unique questions. The presenter is Denise Goodman, Associate Editor of *The Journal of Pediatrics*.

Career Advancement for Clinician Educators: Developing and Navigating a Career Roadmap

Our educator faculty will be presenting this workshop for the 13th year in 2027 and will focus on the development and navigation of a career roadmap that leads to growth of your reputation as a clinician educator. Topics include: Creating a Career Roadmap, Building an Educator Portfolio, Finding Scholarship Success, Negotiating for Your Career, and Developing a Broader Reputation. Sessions will include case scenarios, audience participation, and didactic guidance. Attendees will be free to enter and leave the workshop to accommodate their individual needs.

Obtaining the Fellowship You Desire: Navigating the Subspecialty Match

The fellowship Match presents a unique set of challenges. In this session, residency and fellowship leadership will review the landscape of the fellowship Match and employ case scenarios to provide guidance on skills development, application strategies, interview approaches, and communication methods that are most likely to yield success in the Match. Attendees will be free to enter and leave the workshop to accommodate their individual needs.

The Successful Academician: Building an Academic Vision, Managing Transitions and Negotiations, and Taking Advantage of Artificial Intelligence

The SSCI/SRM is committed to helping individuals gain the skills needed for developing successful careers in academic medicine. In recognition of the importance of early career choices, the SSCI developed a workshop focused on key decisions that typically 'make or break' a career, especially for those engaged in research. This yearly workshop targets trainees and early career faculty in a program designed to help participants through short lectures, interactive panel discussions, and open dialogue sessions. Requirements: Open to all attendees; SSCI Tinsley Harrison Scholars are required to attend.

Clinical Case Report Symposia

The Adult, Pediatric and Neonatal Clinical Case Symposia are devoted to the presentation and discussion of clinical case abstracts highlighting diagnostic and/or management issues. Clinical case descriptions, unique characteristics, treatment/interventions, and results/outcomes are all suitable for presentation at the Clinical Case Symposia. There will be three concurrent sessions: Adult, Neonatology and Pediatrics. At the time of abstract submission, the appropriate abstract category must be checked in order to be considered for the Adult, Neonatology or Pediatric Clinical Case Symposia.

SSCI Awards

Listed below is a description of awards for which you may apply on the abstract electronic submission site. To be eligible for an award, **you must apply at the time of abstract submission.** Select **Apply** for each award that you would like to be considered. **If not** selected, you will **not** be considered for an award. To be eligible for the SSCI awards, you or your mentor (in the case of students and trainees) should be a member in good standing of SSCI. To apply for SSCI membership, go to <https://www.ssciweb.org/membership.php> for information and <https://www.ssciweb.org/new-membership-registration-form.php> to fill out the membership form. In the case of students, they are not eligible for membership, so only the mentor should be a member.

1) **Nathan Solomon & Irene Oransky-Solomon Medical Student Research Awards:** These awards (2) are offered to recognize and encourage excellence in investigation by medical students during research training. Eligibility: Medical Students or Combined MD/ PhD Students who are in research training or were in research training as of June 2026 are eligible. The applicant must be the first author of the abstract submitted in competition for the awards and plan to present the paper during the scientific sessions of the Southern Regional Meetings. Please note that it is necessary for the senior author to be a member of SSCI. Applicants for this award are encouraged to apply for the SSCI Student Award as well. For consideration of this award, the abstract has to suggest: 1) investigator-initiated 2) hypothesis-driven basic, clinical or behavioral research 3) conducted in a mode of discovery 4) whose study design, findings and conclusions satisfied the proposed hypothesis 5) findings have or will have the potential to advance the practice of medicine.

◆ **SSCI Student Research Award:** These awards recognize medical students, and combined MD/PhD students who are accomplished in research. Award funds are intended to defray the costs for participation in the meeting. The awardee must be the first author/presenter of the abstract accepted for presentation at the 2027 meeting. SSCI awardees must register for the meeting and be present at the SSCI Plenary session to receive this award.

◆ **SSCI Trainee Research Award:** These awards recognize residents and fellows who are accomplished in research. Award funds are intended to defray the costs for participation in the meeting. The awardee must be the first author/presenter of the abstract accepted for presentation at the 2027 meeting. SSCI awardees must register for the meeting and be present at the SSCI Plenary session to receive this award.

◆ **SSCI Young Faculty Research Award:** The purpose of these awards is to stimulate participation by faculty at the instructor and assistant professor level. Award funds are intended to defray the costs of participation in the meeting. The awards will be given to the young investigators with the top-rated abstracts. Awardee must be the first author/presenter of an abstract accepted for presentation at the 2027 meeting. SSCI awardees must register for the meeting and be present at the SSCI Plenary session to receive this award. Only faculty at the instructor and assistant professor level are eligible for these awards.

◆ **Michael S. and Kathy J. Bronze Young Investigator Awards:** The Michael S. and Kathy J. Bronze Young Investigator Awards are offered to recognize and encourage excellence in investigation by physicians and medical students during research training. Eligibility: combined MD/PhD students, interns, residents, and post-doctoral physicians who are in research training or were in research training as of June 2026 are eligible. Postdoctoral research training may be considered to extend for a period of up to three years and time spent in strictly clinical fellowships need not count against this. The applicant must be the first author of the abstract submitted in competition for the award and plan to present the paper during the scientific sessions of the Southern Regional Meetings. **Please note that it is necessary for the senior author to be a member of SSCI.** Applicants for this award are encouraged to apply for the appropriate SSCI Award as well. For consideration of this award, the abstract has to suggest: 1) investigator-initiated; 2) hypothesis-driven basic, clinical or behavioral research; 3) conducted in a mode of discovery; 4) whose study design, findings and conclusions satisfied the proposed hypothesis; and 5) findings have or will have the potential to advance the practice of medicine. **Nomination letters from the senior investigator and/or mentor are required and should include a statement of the candidate's role in the study. Incomplete nomination letters will deem the abstract ineligible for consideration. The letters should be uploaded via the ScholarOne website upon submission of the abstract. ◆ **SSCI Tinsley Harrison Scholars:**

The Southern Society for Clinical Investigation (SSCI), an organization that has been advancing medical research for over 80 years, is pleased to again offer the Tinsley Harrison Scholars Program. We are seeking applications from physician-scientists who are senior Postdoctoral Fellows, Instructors, or within their first 5 years as an Assistant Professor. Scholars will participate in this innovative program as part of the Southern Regional Meeting (SRM) in New Orleans, February 18-20, 2027. Selected scholars will attend career development programming with division chiefs and leaders in academic medicine across subspecialties, present their original research, and be paired 1:1 with a mentor to help establish connections outside the scholar's home institution. Those accepted to the program will have their travel expenses (air fare, hotel and registration up to \$1,500) reimbursed. Tinsley Harrison Scholars are expected to attend all required programming events in order to receive reimbursement for their travel. You do not need to be a SSCI member to apply, but if selected, you will need to join.

This is the fourth year of the program. Scholars who participated in the 2024, 2025, & 2026 programs uniformly rated the program as outstanding and a fantastic opportunity to advance their careers. Come join the wonderful community of investigators in the lively setting of New Orleans!

Requirements: To apply, please write a statement (300 words or less) detailing your career goals and how participation as a Tinsley Harrison Scholar aligns with these goals. You must also submit a (1) CV and (2) an abstract of your original research for presentation at the SRM. The deadline for submission of these documents is October 2, 2026.

SSPR Awards

Listed below is a description of awards for which you may apply on the abstract electronic submission site. To be eligible for an award, **you must apply at the time of abstract submission**. Select **Apply** for the award that you would like to be considered. **If not** selected, you will **not** be considered for an award. You must choose only one award matching the award to the society(ies) to which you and your mentor belong. **You must choose one society**.

These awards are for work intimately related to pediatric research. For Young Investigator Awards, the applicant **MUST** be an SSPR member or have a sponsor who is an SSPR member. The candidates must check the appropriate award box in order to be considered. You cannot apply for the other society awards if applying for SSPR Awards. The Member/Sponsor name must also be filled in on the electronic submission form.

◆ **SSPR Young Investigator Award:**

SSPR Young Investigator Award: Eligible candidates include students, residents, fellows, and young faculty who are currently within 7 years of the completion of training. Candidates must check the appropriate award box in order to be considered. Research and Quality Improvement abstracts will be considered. Case reports are not eligible for this award. The nominee must be first author/presenter of the abstract accepted for presentation. A letter from the senior investigator or sponsor that includes a statement that the work was performed by the nominee and fully addresses the role the candidate had in the work must be received by October 2, 2026 and uploaded via the ScholarOne website upon submission of your abstract. The sponsor letter requirement is waived for young faculty but required for trainees. Finalists will be notified in December 2026 and will present the study results at the SSPR Plenary Session at the 2027 SRM meeting. They will be required to submit a one page narrative describing their work, along with their presentation slides, 2 weeks prior to the meeting. Finalists will receive a stipend of \$500 to facilitate attendance at the meeting and will have their meeting registration paid by the SSPR. ◆ **SSPR Young Faculty Travel Award:**

SSPR Young Faculty Travel Award: This award is to facilitate travel for outstanding young faculty. Research and Quality Improvement abstracts will be considered. Case reports are not eligible for this award. The candidate must be an Instructor or Assistant Professor and within 7 years of the completion of fellowship training. They must be first author/presenter of the abstract accepted for presentation. Approximately 5 awardees will receive a travel stipend of \$500. They will also have their meeting registration paid by the SSPR. Faculty that are candidates for the SSPR Young Investigator Awards will automatically be entered in this competition.

◆ **SSPR Trainee Travel Award:**

The candidate must be a student, resident, or fellow. They must be the first author/presenter of the abstract accepted for presentation. Approximately 25 candidates will receive a travel stipend of \$500. Trainees that are candidates for the SSPR Young Investigator Awards will automatically be entered in this competition.
